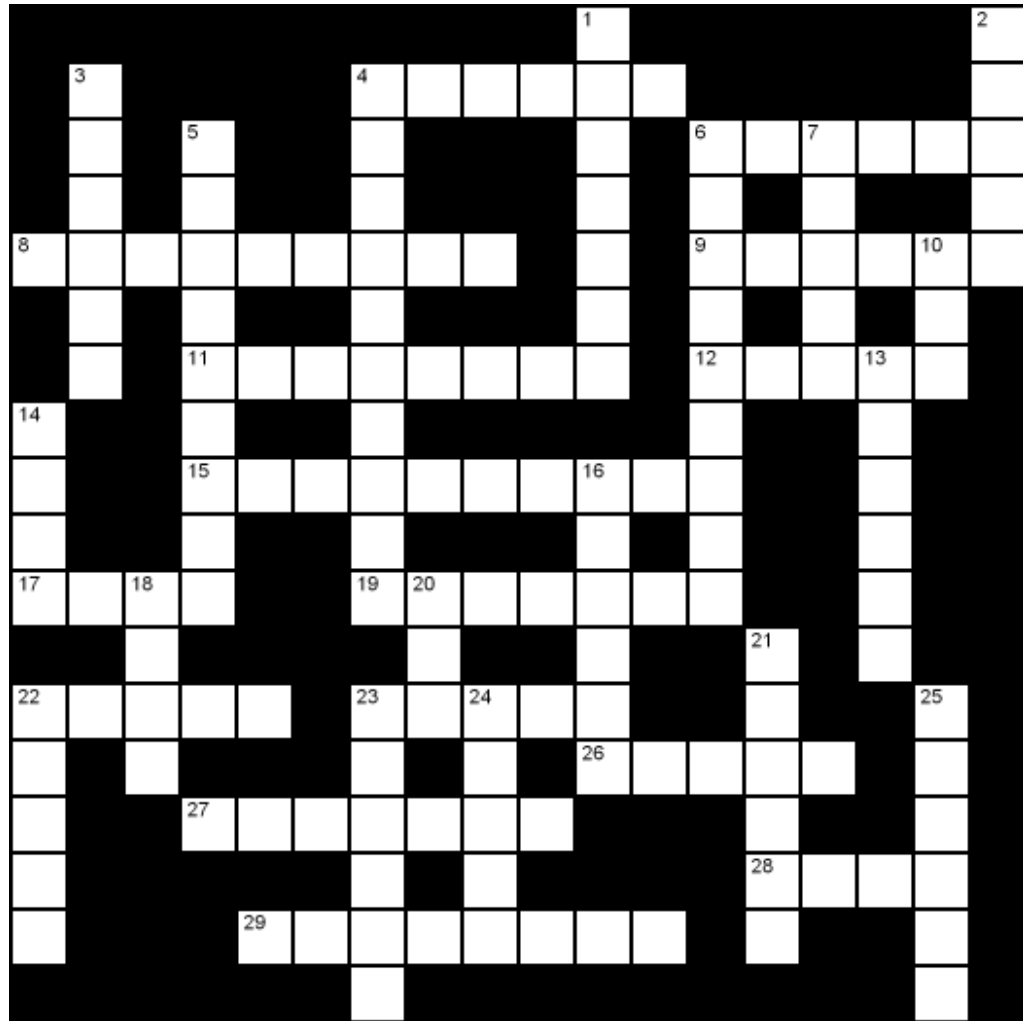


## A20 Road to Emmaus, Luke 24:13-35, Third Sunday of Easter

Jesus disguised himself on the Road to Emmaus. The two men discovered he was Christ when he broke bread with them. Christians made a secret word using the letters from the Greek word for Fish – ICHTHYS. It stood for Jesus Christ, God’s Son and Saviour. Using the fish symbol helped Christians pray and worship together safely at home or in a catacomb. Early Christians also made a cross on their foreheads to offer their day to Jesus Christ. To show they are Christians today, people make a big sign of the cross on the forehead, heart, and shoulders.
